


# 2024 Annual Report

**Our Mission:** The Children's Book Project gives free books to children who need them, and free literacy resources to the educators and organizations who serve them, to promote equity in literacy, learning, and life.


**Our Method:** Our programs provide the resources to create readingrich environments and inspire new generations of lifelong readers in partnership with educators and community members who support the education, literacy, health, housing needs, and cognitive development of children (ages 0–18) from low-income, marginalized, and at-risk communities.

**Our Impact:** Since our founding in 1992, we have given away over 3.3 million books to children—always for free and for keeps; offered workforce development opportunities for teens and college interns; increased access to books with diverse characters and in multiple languages; hosted field trips with authors and illustrators for elementary school children, inspiring them to become readers, writers, and artists; and provided resources that improve reading proficiency and support parent/child bonding.

# **OUR PROGRAMS**

#### Storytime

This program offers field trips for Title 1 elementary schools at our Book Bank, where children meet and interact with published children's book authors. The authors read their work aloud and hold discussions with children about reading and writing, and personally sign their books for each student. Authors/illustrators draw with the students, who each receive free notebooks and colored markers to take home so they can write and illustrate their own books. After meeting the author, students select free books from the Book Bank for themselves and their siblings, and take the books home in free tote bags decorated with children's art.

## **Second Reading**

Our Second Reading program places thousands of titles each year in under-resourced "book desert" communities throughout San Francisco and beyond to ensure children who would otherwise have little or no access to books can build their personal libraries for free.

#### **Teen Ambassadors**

This program provides workforce development and community service opportunities for high school students who love books and reading, empowering them to spread the joy of book ownership with their school community and to become active participants in our mission.



#### **Interns & Volunteers**

Individual, family, or corporate volunteer opportunities and college credit internships offer more ways to help fulfill our mission and provide workforce development opportunities in the literacy arena.

### **Community Liaisons**

With staff assistance, volunteers identify and regularly stock public health clinics and other community organizations serving the most vulnerable children and families with books that meet the needs of their constituencies.



### **Book Bank**

Our Book Bank in San Francisco's Bayview District offers hundreds of thousands of free, high-interest books for children ages 0–18 and teacher resources for their educators. The Book Bank is arranged like an independent bookstore with over 90 categories, but every book is free. We offer books by diverse authors and feature inclusive characters so children have both a mirror that reaffirms their own experience and a window to others' perspectives.

## **Read Aloud**

This early literacy development program trains community partners via expert-led workshops for professionals who work with groups of parents of kids ages 0–5. We provide curriculum materials, expert guest lecturers, and thousands of new, diverse, multilingual books each year in a variety of difficultto-source languages, including Amharic, Arabic, Chinese, Korean, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, and Vietnamese, all for free.



The Library of Congress' new National Ambassador for Young People's Literature, Mac Barnett, led a recent Storytime at our Book Bank. Mac read from his graphic novel *The First Cat in Space Ate Pizza* with 5th graders from a local Title 1 elementary school and answered their questions about reading and writing.

include: "Do you have all the books in the world?" and "Is this a museum?" After Storytime, we're thrilled and gratified to hear comments like: "I want to be a writer!" or "This was the best field trip of my life!"

# **Books for Deaf & Hard of Hearing Students**



Longtime supporters Paula and John Foley recently donated hundreds of beautiful, new children's books featuring Deaf or Hard of Hearing characters in memory of her brother Claude Shirts, an American Sign Language interpreter for students.

Shortly after publicizing this new Book Bank section, we were delighted to find two classes of Deaf and Hard of Hearing public school students, their teachers, and interpreters on our doorstep. The kids and teachers loved their visit to the Book Bank, were amazed at the curated selection of children's books that explore the vast range of experiences of Deaf and Hard of Hearing children, and selected 90 books for the students to take home and for their two classrooms, all for free.


# **Volunteer Spotlight: Ella Hansen**




#### **Expenses**
